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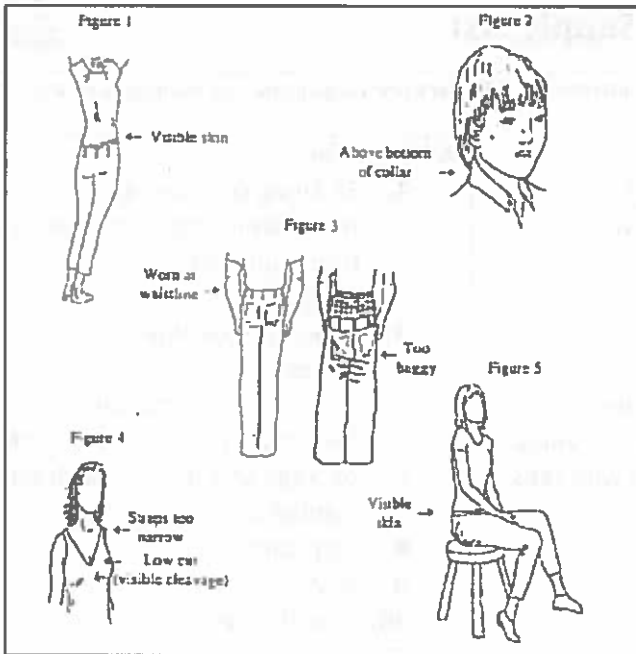

*The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:*

**General Guidelines**

1. The District does not allow pictures, emblems, or writings on clothing that are lewd, offensive, vulgar or obscene.
2. The District does not allow pictures, emblems or writings on clothing that advertise or depict tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, inhalants or any other intoxicant or mood-changing, mind-altering or behavior-altering drugs.
3. All school attire and personal appearance shall be in keeping with acceptable standards of modesty and good taste.
4. Baggy/oversized clothing is not allowed. Garments should be appropriately sized and fitted for the individual. Any jeans or pants that cannot stay at the natural waistline without a belt shall not be allowed. The crotch area will not be allowed to sag (Figure 3).

5. Students are required to wear shoes or sandals. Flip-flops of any kind, shower shoes, slides, and house shoes are not allowed. Interpretation is at the discretion of the principal or assistant principal.

6. Noisy or distracting jewelry will not be allowed. Pierced body ornamentation must be restricted to the earlobes. Other piercing is not allowed. Earrings will not be worn by boys.

7. Hair may not be colored or groomed in such a way so as to draw attention or separate the student from the rest of the student body. **No unnatural coloring of hair.** No "un-natural" hair extensions such as feathers, tinsel will be allowed.

8. (Grades 3-12) Shorts should be appropriate dress type shorts. No P.E. or athletic shorts are allowed (no elastic waistbands). Shorts must be worn at or below the fingertips with the shoulders relaxed and hands hanging loosely at the sides and may not sag.

9. (Grades 3-12) See-through or unusually tight blouses, shirts, or sweaters may not be worn.

10. Sunglasses will not be worn inside the building unless prescribed by a doctor.

11. Hats, caps or hoods will not be worn inside the building during school hours.

12. Sweat type headbands, armbands, chain type billfolds, or bandanas will not be worn.

13. In addition to the prohibition in the general guidelines, shirts or trousers with writings that contains double meanings, references to sex, satanic cults, gang activities, or any other controversial subjects will not be permitted (ex: Joe's Crab Shack, Playboy Bunnies, Hotties, Hooters, Foxy, or any other sayings that portray a negative image). Any clothing or symbols that are associated with negative group behavior (Dickeys, washcloths, bandanas, colors, etc.) will not be allowed.

14. (Grade 6-12) Warm-ups and sweat suit garments will not be allowed except in approved physical education classes or as a travel uniform issued by the Athletic Department/Cheer Squad to be worn as travel garments or with the approval of the principal. Pajamas are not allowed. Leggings, Jeggings, or Spandex tights are not allowed unless a garment covers them that meets the dress code requirements.

15. Tattoos (permanent or temporary) will not be visible. The only exception will be temporary tattoos depicting school spirit approved by the building principal.

16. Trench coats or oversized coats will not be allowed.

17. All garments must be properly hemmed (no cut-offs or frayed edges).

18. **Ripped, cut or torn clothing is not to be worn.** Only appropriate patches on the outside of clothing will be permitted.

**Boys:** Young men must be clean shaven at all times with side burns no longer than the bottom of the earlobe, and no wider than one inch. Earrings are not allowed. Hair shall be neat and not distracting and be kept out of the face and cannot extend below the bottom of the collar on an oxford style shirt while the student is standing in a normal position. No ponytails or "tails" allowed. Shirts and T-shirts with a straight cut bottom hem will not be required to be tucked in but oxford style shirts or others with rounded and /or split hems (a.k.a. tails) shall be tucked in (Grades 6-12). All shirts must have sleeves. Oxford style shirts must be buttoned to the first button below the collar.

**Girls:** Grooming will comply with general guidelines. Hair shall be neat and not distracting and should be kept out of the face. Tank shirts or similar garments shall not be worn. Shoulder straps must be at least three inches wide and be worn over the shoulder. Shirts and tops must be buttoned and cut as to not show cleavage when standing up or bending over (Figure 4). The midriff must not be exposed when the student goes through the normal activities of the school day (bending, stretching, reaching, sitting, or raising hands, etc.) (Figures 1 and 5). Baggy clothing shall be prohibited (including extra-long t-shirts). Any jeans or pants that cannot stay at the natural waistline without a belt shall be prohibited. The crotch area will not be allowed to sag (Figure 3). Dresses and skirts and slits of dresses/skirts must be worn within three inches below finger tip length with the shoulders relaxed and hands at the sides at the shortest part of the hem.

*If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given the opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student will be assigned to on campus or in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until the parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school. Repeat offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.*
